Detective Novels.

Detective novel / fiction is a subgenre of crime fiction and mystery fiction in which an investigator or a detective - either professional, amateur or retired - investigates a crime, often murder. The detective genre began and grew along other genre fiction in the mid-nineteenth century and has remained extremely popular, particularly in novels.

The period between World War I and World War II is generally referred to as the Golden Age of Detective fiction. During this period, a number of very popular writers emerged, including mostly British but also a notable subset of American and New Zealand writers. Female writers constituted a major portion of notable Golden Age writers.

Partition Literature

It is a nuanced depiction of the tragedy of Partition, a period in India's history that is very hard to make sense of. It is an amalgamation of history, conflict studies, border studies, and politics. It attempts to bring out a record how human disaster and the pitiable condition have been taken place during the gruesome period of the partition.

* 'Toba Tek Singh' which describes the exchange of mental asylums inmates between India and Pakistan in the wake of partition, is Saadat Hasan Manto's most well-known short story.

In 'Toba Tek Singh', Manto uses the madness of the asylum as a metonym for the madness that wreaks havoc in the nation at the time of partition.
